ABERDEEN PROVING GROUND, Md. -- Meeting the nutritional needs and taste preferences of 1.9 million War fighters every day is vital to America's success in battlefield missions, combat feeding officials said. "The most important thing on the battlefield is to unburden, empower and protect the Soldiers," said Jeremy Whitsitt, program outreach and education coordinator for the Department of Defense Combat Feeding Directorate at Natick Soldier Research, Development and Engineering Center. CFD personnel are continually trying to improve field rations to please their customers – War fighters.

"Our customers carry weapons, so we don't want to antagonize them," Whitsitt said jokingly to a group of about 80 Soldiers and civilians. Whitsitt and Evan Bick, assistant program outreach and education coordinator for CFD, spoke Aug. 17 at the Association of the U.S. Army-Aberdeen Chapter luncheon at Top of the Bay. Whitsitt recited the event that drove major changes to combat feeding. On a late Friday afternoon in 1991, Gen. Colin Powell called high-ranking CFD officials in Natick, Mass., to the Pentagon for an urgent meeting. When they arrived, Powell held up a Meal Ready-to-Eat and said, "See this? Fix it." New EFV Prototype Tests at Pendleton

Calif. -- Approaching a black dot on the GPS system, a squawk of radio static is followed by "this is command, approaching buoy alpha." The vehicle commander replies with an affirming "roger command," and a powerful roar erupts off to the left of Col. Keith Moore's rigid-hulled inflatable boat, more commonly known as a RHIB. The newest variant of the Expeditionary Fighting Vehicle throttles all 2,700 horsepower and lifts out of the glassy water gliding like a jet ski. Although the EFV program manager's RHIB has no problem keeping up with the 30 mph speed of the 78,000-pound EFV, it is a breathtaking advancement from its venerable predecessor, the Amphibious Assault Vehicle, which comparatively crawls at 9 mph in water. MARINE TIDBITS:

LITTLE KNOWN TIDBIT OF NAVAL HISTORY....for our Navy Members and Associate Members.

The U.S.S. Constitution (Old Ironsides), as a combat vessel, carried 48,600 gallons of fresh water for her crew of 475 officers and men. This was sufficient to

last six months of sustained operations at sea. She carried no evaporators (i.e fresh water distillers).

However, let it be noted that according to her ship's log, "On July 27, 1798, the U.S.S. Constitution sailed from Boston with a full complement of 475 officers and men, 48,600 gallons of fresh water, 7400 cannon shot, 11,600 pounds of black powder and 79,400 gallons of rum." Her mission: "To destroy and harass English shipping."

Making Jamaica on 6 October, she took on 826 pounds of flour and 68,300 gallons of rum. Then she headed for the Azores, arriving there 12 November. She provisioned with 550 pounds of beef and 64,300 gallons of Portuguese wine.

On 18 November, she set sail for England. In the ensuing days she defeated five British men-of-war and captured and scuttled 12 English merchant ships, salvaging only the rum aboard each.

By 26 January, her powder and shot were exhausted. Nevertheless, although unarmed she made a night raid up the Firth of Clyde in Scotland. Her landing party captured a whisky distillery and transferred 40,00 gallons of single malt Scotch aboard by dawn. Then she headed home.

The U.S.S. Constitution arrived in Boston on 20 February 1799 with no cannon shot, no food, no powder, no rum, no wine, no whisky and 38,600 gallons of water.
